

## Labor to Birth What to Expect

At last you've made it to the final stretch of your pregnancy: labor and delivery. Here's a brief description of the process.

## The Six Steps to Birth

The following six steps must take place before a vaginal birth. The first three usually begin weeks or days before labor, the last three during labor.

- 1. The cervix moves forward
- 2. The cervix ripens, or softens
- 3. The cervix effaces, thins, or shortens
- 4. The cervix dilates, or opens
- 5. The fetal head rotates
- 6. The fetus descends through the pelvis

## **Stages of Labor**

Labor divided into distinct stages according to the physiological changes that take place.

**PRE-LABOR** (non-progressing contractions) causes ripening, effacement, and forward movement of the cervix; ends when contractions progress (become longer, stronger, and closer together).



FIRST STAGE (*dilation*) begins with progressing contractions and ends when the cervix is completely open.

**SECOND STAGE** (descent and birth) begins when the cervix is fully dilated and ends when the baby is born.

**THIRD STAGE** (delivery of the placenta) begins with the birth of the baby and ends with the delivery of the placenta.

**FOURTH STAGE** (recovery) begins after the placenta is born and ends one to several hours later when the mother's condition stabilizes.
